Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District (the District), as of and for the year ended June 30, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the District's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

- 1. Regional Recycled Water Concept Study in 2016
- Development of a regional RW conveyance and recharge system in 2018 - Weaver Basins and RRWP
- 3. Series of Agreements with EVWD
- 4. Construction completed in December 2023
- 5. Complexity and long-term of referenced critical documents
- 6. Joint Use Agreement development since May



AGREEMENT ELEMENTS

- 1. Term: Initial 10-yr with automatic renewals for successive 5-yr terms
- 2. Scope: Operations and use of the RRWS, which includes the RRWP and Weaver Basins, for recharge of recycled water (RW)
- **3. Responsibilities**: To govern operations and use of the RRWS for groundwater recharge. In general, East Valley shall be responsible for the RW and its WQ, and SB Valley will serve as the transmitter of RW
- **4. Ad Hoc**: The draft Agreement was presented to the District's Regional Recycled Water Ad Hoc Committee members (Kielhold and Botello) and is being forwarded to the full Board for consideration

JOINT USE AGREEMENT FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE REGIONAL RECYCLED WATER PIPELINE AND THE WEAVER BASINS

In is Joint Use Agreement ("Agreement") for the operations and maintenance of the Waver Basins and Reginal Recycled Water Poplenie is entered into and effective as of this Study day of January, 2024 ("Effective Date"), by and between San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District ("San Bernardino Valley") and the East Valley Water District ("East Valley"). San Bernardino Valley and East Valley may be referred to individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties".

RECITAL

WHEREAS, on September I, 2015, the Parties executed the Framework Agreement for the Construction and Operation of Potential Groundwater Replacishment Facilities Fe'Framework Agreement" [attached hereto as Attachment A]). The Parties agreed in the Framework Agreement to work collaboratively towards the construction and operation of a wastewater treatment facility that would enable the Parties to replenish groundwater supplies in the San Bernardino Basin Area;

San Bernardino Valley, as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (*CEQA**), certified a Final Environmental Impact Report (*Final EIR**) lattached hereto as Attachment Bj. and associated Minigation Monitoring and Reporting Flan (*MMRP**) lattached hereto as Attachment C.) for the Sterling Natural Resource Center (*SNRC*), an advanced treatment facility capable of treating up to eight (8) million gallons per day (*mgd*) with an anticipated expanded capacity of ten (10) mgd, on March 16, 2016 (State Clearinghouse [SCH] No. 20151010SS).

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2016, San Bernardino Valley filed a wastewater change petition ("Petition"), pursuant to California Water Code section 1211, with the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Water Board"), to change the point of discharge, place of use, purpose of use, and quantity of discharge of East Valley's treated wastewater discharged to the Santa Ana River;

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2017, San Bernardino Valley, East Valley, and the Center for Biological Diversity ("CBD") executed a Memorandum of Understanding for Species and Water Management in the San Bernardino Basin Area ("CBD MOU") (attached hereto as Attachment D) to resolve the CBD's protest against the Petition. The CBD MOU may be amended in the future to reflect changed conditions.)

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2017, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service ("USFWS") issued: blookjeal opinion "2017 Bidp" fattached as Attachment E.) (FWS-S8-1 bloobile3-1/7038) for the construction and operation of the SNRC in accordance with section 7 of the Federal Endangered Species Act. - 3. EV to implement all the requirements:
 - Final EIR, MMRP, Settlement Agreement, Order WW0095, the 2017 BiOp, the HCP, and associated amendments
- 4. Draining pipeline during repairs/inspections
- 5. Develop a FS for alternative emergency discharges
- 6. Owner of the Emergency Basins
- 7. Water quality reporting and monitoring, and sharing access to SB Valley
- 8. Initiating Off-Spec discharges, when necessary with coordination with SB Valley

JOINT USE AGREEMENT FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE REGIONAL RECYCLED WATER PIPELINE AND THE WEAVER BASINS

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SB VALLEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- As the owner of the RRWS facilities, SB Valley will serve as the transmitter and recharger of the RW
- 2. SB Valley reserves the right to allow any other potential discharges, including imported water, stormwater, RW, (including upcoming SB)
- 3. SB Valley shall be responsible for maintenance and repairs of the facilities, pipelines, or appurtenances that compose the RRWS
- 4. SB Valley may temporarily shut off RW to the Weaver Basins during emergency circumstances


