FY 2019/20 BUDGET = \$750,000

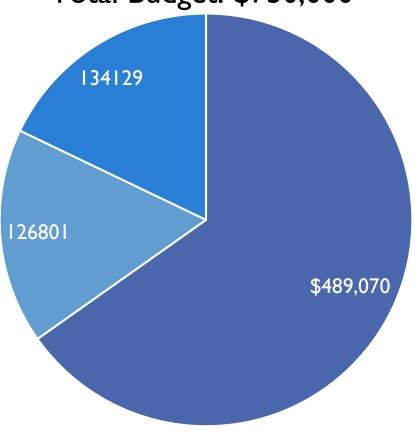
- Conservation Rebates 25% reimbursement to retailers

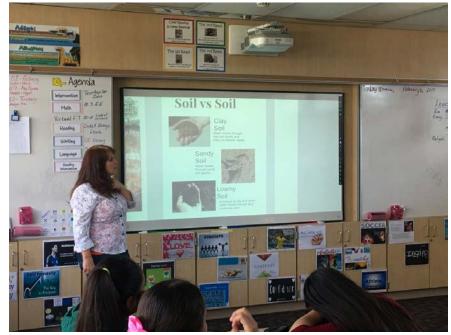

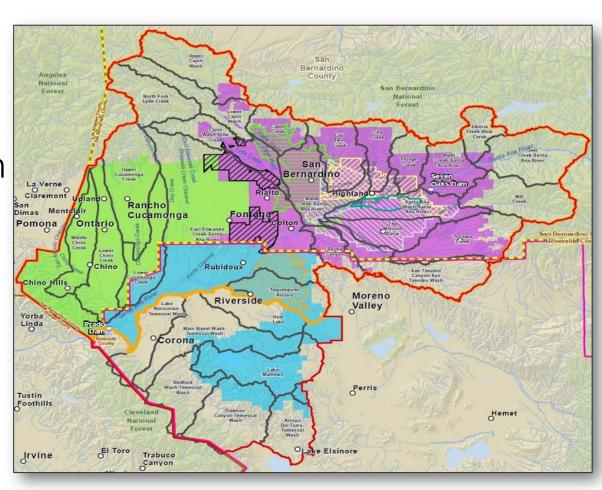

HCP Conservation Strategy – 22 species

- Long-term Monitoring Program (Monitoring and Adaptive Management)
 - Permittees will need to monitor and track land set aside for mitigation
 - What to track?
 - Presence of Covered Species
 - Health of Habitat and Wildlife
 - Success of habitat enhancement/restoration activities









Adaptive Management

• Definition: is a structured, iterative process of robust decision making in the face of uncertainty, with an aim to reducing uncertainty over time via system monitoring. (thank you Wikipedia)

Process

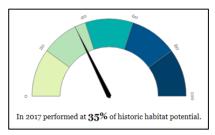
- 1. Identify uncertainty in a management system,
- 2. Apply management action,
- 3. Monitor to inform uncertainty and viability of the purpose of the action,
- 4. Analyze results,
- 5. Provide informed conclusions that address management uncertainty,
- 6. Refine future management action to better address management action.

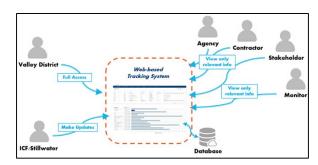


Planning Grant - Section 6 (nontraditional)

- Submitted April 2019 by Valley District on behalf of HCP Permittees
- Purpose Develop the Long-Term Monitoring Program for HCP
 - Demonstrates to regulatory agencies that Permittees are following through with mitigation commitments
 - Tasks
 - 1. Develop an Integrated Strategy LTMP
 - 2. Preparation of the LTMP
 - Develop Database and Web-Based Reporting Platform to Effectively Store and Present the Conservation Program Scientific Results

Criteria for Grant Acceptance - Budget

Board needs to approve commitment of matching funds - up to \$875,000

- HCP partners will reimburse Valley District approximately 60% (\$525,000).
- Valley District's fiscal impact \$350,000

Breakdown of Budget

 Primary - Document, Database, Web-based Reporting Tool 	\$600,000
 Independent - Hydrology Peer Review 	\$ 50,000
Independent - Groundwater Peer Review	\$ 50,000
 Independent - Sediment Transport Peer Review 	\$ 50,000
 Independent - Riparian Communities/Birds Peer Review 	\$ 75,000
Independent - Fisheries Peer Review	\$ 50,000

Individual SOW's will be presented to Board for approval when developed



Staff Recommendation

- Board accept this recommended grant award
 - By doing so Board agrees that Valley District will provide non-federal funds in the amount of \$875,000 to match the amount of the federally funded portion of the grant (\$875,000). Total = \$1,750,000 applied to LTMP
- Staff recommends Board direct staff to prepare
 - 1. a Resolution accepting the grant award and
 - 2. a Matching Funds Commitment Letter

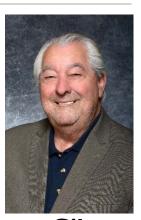
