State Legislative Update

- PCL/Law Professors Study-Inspired Legislation Will Be Subject of Much Debate
 - AB 2639, (Quirk-D) would require the State Water Board to adopt a final update of a specified water quality control plan for the Bay-Delta and to implement the final San Joaquin River/Southern Delta update adopted 20XX by December 31, 2023
 - AB 2108, (R. Rivas-D and E. Garcia-D) related to qualifications of those who are appointed to the State Water Board and that the State and Regional Boards begin addressing issues of environmental justice and social equity as early as possible in project planning process
 - SB 1205, (Allen-D) would require the State Water Board develop/adopt regulations to provide more specifics of the methods and practices for determining water availability related to water right permits and licenses, including considering the effects of climate change

- SWP Subsidence & Sites Funding and Legislation

 - SB 559 (Hurtado-D) and SB 890 (Nielsen-R and Borgeas-R)
- Effort to Require Study/Analysis of SWRCB Fees and Nexus with Programs
- Bills to Add CEQA and Planning Process to New Projects in Disadvantaged Communities
 - AB 1001 and AB 1749 (C. Garcia-D)
 - Other
 - SB 2142 would exempt rebates for turf replacement programs
 - AB 1157 would implement indoor residential water use standards recommended by DWR and SWQRCB; would lower the indoor gallons per capita daily
 - AB 2374 increased fines for illegal dumping
