Consider Approval of Resolution 1154 Establishing the Appropriation Subject to Limit for Fiscal Year 2022-23

State Government Code requires a governing board to annually adopt, by resolution, an Appropriation limit for the upcoming fiscal year.

The limit is adjusted each year by the change in California per capita personal income and the change in the population in our area. These change percentages are supplied to the District by the California Department of Finance.

For the upcoming fiscal year 2022-2023 the appropriation limit is calculated at \$ 35,428,727.

In calculating the tax appropriations subject to the limit, expenditures for qualified capital outlays and the debt service on voter approved bonds are not included.

The amount of General Fund property tax revenue budgeted and spent by Valley District each fiscal year is less than \$11.9 million dollars. This total is well below the appropriation limits.

The auditing firm of Rogers, Anderson, Malody and Scott have performed an independent review of the appropriations limit worksheets and agrees with the calculations provided by Staff.


